

(Flyvbjerg, et al., 2016)



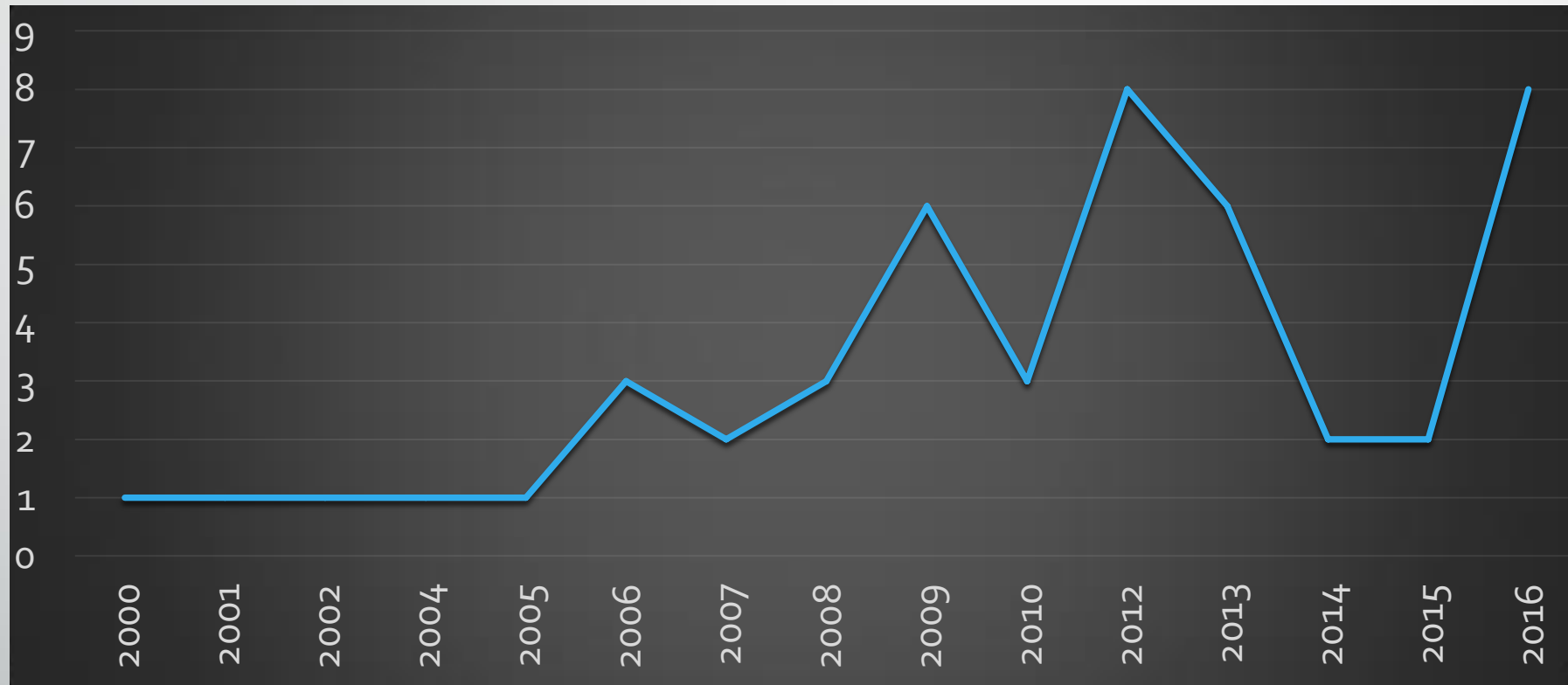
Denver International Airport
