Mirriam Samson moved from East New Britain to Milne Bay 16 years ago. In her story, Mirriam Samson describes an incident in her community in Milne Bay where people accused someone of being a sorcerer. She felt that this was causing disharmony in the community. With the help of her husband, the Bishop, and peace officers she brought people together to mediate and reconcile.
